Park Projects Planned For 2024

Civic Center ADA Ramp – Plans for an updated and repaired ADA ramp to enter the Hammond Civic Center is currently being planned for 2024.

Harrison Park - Harrison Park was awarded a \$100,000 grant from the Lake Michigan Coastal Program to dredge out the bottom of the Harrison Park pond for the purpose of returning the pond to a live body of water to not only help the drainage of the park, but to return fish to the pond. Mayor McDermott Jr. and Councilman Tyler are committing \$50,000 each to match the grant awarded to the LMCP.

Columbia Park – Plans to add a foot golf course are being discussed. Foot Golf is a course designed to play golf, but with a soccer ball. The popularity is growing throughout the country and Hammond wants to be one of the first cities to incorporate a course into a public park.









2023 Urban Forestry Report – By: Devin Wick

The 2023 forestry report for Hammond shows more good signs of returning to pre Covid levels of care with another year of improvement. The efforts to remedy the dead, dying and dangerous trees has remained the same for the last few years. This year's total being two hundred and fifty-two trees removed in 2023. We are putting forth every effort to increase our rate of removals and alleviate the back log of tree issues created during the pandemic.

Our effort to remove problem trees is continuing to reduce the issues being reported every month. Our numbers for 2023 dropped for a fourth straight year to 236 new issues being reported for an average of 20.5 risk assessments per month. That is down from 2020 when we were at 40 assessments per month, 2021 at 31 assessments a month and 2022 at 25 assessments per month.

The help of our forestry partners, community volunteers and a mandate from Mayor Thomas McDermott Jr. to plant more trees, we were able to plant 269 new trees in 2023. We were also able to increase the donation of indigenous trees to the community and donated 200 trees to Hammond residents at our annual flower giveaway.

Finally, thanks to the wise stewardship of our urban forest, Hammond has maintained its status as an Arbor Day Association "Tree City" for the fourteenth year in a row.

Record Crowds Continue For 2023 Festival of The Lakes



The growth of the Festival of the Lakes crowds continues to impress city officials. This year we saw over 55,000 visitors over the five day event. This was also the first year the city added a fully ticketed event on Saturday July 15th for Lil Wayne. We had over 14,000 visitors on that night, which only trails Sunday night's record crowd of over 19,000 guests. Last years acts continued the tradition of appealing to all NWI residents as we started the week with Twista, Ashanti and Ja Rule on Wednesday, Ingrid Andress and Brothers Osbourne on Thursday, Local H and Stone Temple Pilots on Friday, Lil Wayne on Saturday, and Luis Angel "El Flaco" to finish up the Festival on Sunday. The Festival of the Lakes is a week long celebration of the city. But it is more than just concerts though, as the kick off / sponsor party for the Festival started the Friday prior at 18th St. Brewery. Some other events surrounding the week long celebration included The Mayor's Golf Tournament, Senior Day Event, Polka Party, Hot Rod Car Show, Fishing Derby, Gospel Brunch, 5K run and, of course, the Carnival and food court were rewarded with huge crowds too.

The Hammond Sportsplex once again exceeded the one million dollar mark in revenue and continues to expand its reach in Hammond and Northwest Indiana while also adding some regional and national events. On September 7th the Sportsplex opened four new top of the line sand volleyball courts in front of the building to expand our volleyball offerings. The building serves as a training facility for Purdue Northwest baseball, softball and soccer teams during the winter months. We host the Division II Midwest Region Volleyball Crossover event. The facility also serves as an off season training facility for local professionals playing internationally.

The Sportsplex continues to offer space for the local community as well. It hosts birthday parties, local basketball and soccer leagues and is the perfect big venue for fund raisers and company parties. The lounge on the 2nd level is perfect for business meetings.

We have indoor winter leagues at the Sportsplex but also offer an outdoor season at the Hessville Soccer Complex. FC Kicker's is a beginners program for kids wanting to play soccer with fun drills and games.
